ADMISSION 2019-20

Admission to the BA (Hons) & General courses take place during the month of June, soon after publication of the results of HS Examination of WBCHSE, ISC & CBSC Boards.

Admission Forms are available online. Admission is carried out strictly on the basis of Merit List published by the College Authority. All the admissions are completed in accordance with the University Of Calcutta norms and Government Order.

GENERAL OVERVIEW OF UG COURSE UNDER THREE YEAR CBCS

A candidate, willing to take admission to the Under Graduate degree courses (2019-20) of the University Of Calcutta shall have to pursue semester wise three years course under CBCS as per Calcutta University regulations vide notification (Ref. No. CUS/268 (Cir.)/18, dated 07 May, 2018).

A candidate pursuing a regular course of study for three year semester wise degree course shall have to clear all the semesters in all respects within a span of five years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

POST GRADUATION

Distance Courses for M.A. in Bengali English, Political Science, Public Administration, History, Education from Netaji Subhash Open University (NSOU) has started from the 2017-'18 session. MSW (Master of Social Works), MLIS (Master of Library and Information Science) along with BLIS (Bachelor of Library & Informations Science) from Netaji Subhash Open University has been introduced from the academic session 2017-18.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SYSTEM

National Service Scheme (N.S.S.)	In the month of December' 16, our college embarked on a new journey with National Service Scheme (N.S.S.). At the end of the Academic Year 2016-17, the compliance to initiate Unit-I of National Service Scheme was fetched from University of Calcutta. Since then this unit has been functioning relentlessly with a steadfast goal to bring in holistic changes inside the campus as well as the in the communities dwelling in the area. Mainly two types of programmes are conducted by N.S.S. Unit 1. Regular Activities 2. Special Camp. CAREER CONSELING CELL	Apart from providing the idea ambience for imbibing education, the Career Counseling Cell of our college does take active initiative to cater help the students find the right path for their desired profession. Till date different companies and professionals the Institute of company Secretaries of India, iLEAP, LICl, and Neotia University paid visits to our college to impart the students about the prospects of different professions.
SC-ST-OBC CELL	The BCW cell has been established to implement Governmental policies and programme to pray the facilities to SC/ST/OBC students.

COURSE AND CREDIT STRUCTURE :

- 1 Theoretical class of 1 hour duration = 1 Credit
- 1 Tutorial class of 1 hour duration = 1 Credit
- 1 Practical class of 2 hour duration = 1 Credit
- Each semester duration = At least 15 weeks of direct teaching

ATTENDANCE :

- A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the Calcutta University regulations.
- A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed short percentage fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

(*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.)

EXAMINATION :

- The 3 year B.A. /B.Sc. / B.Mus. (Honours and General) Course of Studies under CBCS shall consist of Six (6) Semesters (Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V and Semester-VI).
- End Semester Examinations are to be held ordinarily at the end of the concerned Semester, i.e., Semester-I, Semester-III, Semester-V in December-January and Semester-II, Semester-IV, Semester-VI in June-July.
- End Semester Examinations will be held for 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. 50% of the total marks assigned to Internal Assessment (i.e., 10 marks for a full paper of 100 or 5 marks for a Module of 50, as the case may be) will be assessed on the basis of Internal Examination and remaining 50% will be assessed based on the class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later).
- The students are to be informed about the modalities of internal assessment well in advance.

COLLEGE RULES

It is compulsory for all students to maintain the discipline inside and outside the classrooms. Students shall strictly abide the Rules and regulations of the college. These rules are as follows:

- ? The students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
- ? Required attendance in class as per rules is compulsory for the students. Attendance of 75% and above as required to qualify as a Collegiate Student. Attendance of 60% to 74% will make a student Non-Collegiate. Attendance below 60% not eligible to sit in the University Examination.
- ? Any student absent in any examination on medical grounds must submit before the end of the examination or within 7 days of its termination a Medical Certificate and a letter to the Principal/H.O.D from the guardian stating the ground for his/her absence. Such case may be considered with sympathy, but it must be understood that illness is not itself a valid excuse.
- ? Students must consult the College Notice Boards every day for important announcements, failing which the college will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them.
- ? Students must carry Identity Cards (issued by the college) with them during college hours inside the campus.
- ? Students must be in their classes and take their seats at the beginning of each period. They must not enter or leave the class room without permission.
- ? College property, furniture, library books etc. must be treated with due care.
- ? Impersonation at roll-call is a punishable offence.
- ? Students must maintain decent and cordial relationship with faculty and staff and among themselves.
- ? Smoking, chewing tobacco products, spitting and loitering are strictly prohibited.
- ? Students are strictly directed not to pass/make any adverse comments in any social media against the college administration, education policy or against any teaching and non-teaching staff before/without informing /approaching the Principal with grievance. This kind of activities which may tarnish the image of the institution shall be treated as unpardonable offence.
- ? The usage of any abusive and derogatory language/comments/gestures on and off the college premises are punishable offences. Any kind of harassment/ragging/malpractice shall be treated as punishable offences. For any complaint, students are to inform the anti-ragging committee with grievance.

- ? Students who fail to attend 60% of classes are not entitled for any concession in student's fees/ financial help from Students Aid Fund.
- ? Students are to pay their fees within 10th of every month at accounts section of the college. Otherwise name of the student may be struck off from the attendance register and a fine @ Rs. 5/-per month will be charged in case of default.
- ? The security deposits will be returned to the students after one year after completion of the University courses. In the case of damage of college property, the value of damage will be deducted from the deposits.
- ? In case of return of library deposit, the receipt in original will be required to be deposited along with the application. In this case, an application should be submitted within one year of the last University examination, failing which the deposit will be forfeited.

LIBRARY RULES

The college authority is trying its best to keep a good collection of both text and reference books in the library. Students may borrow books for seven days only. Here are the rules to access it:

- ? On production of the college Identity Card, each student will be provided with library card against which books will be issue.
- ? Library Cards are non-transferable.

- ? If the books are returned after the due date a fine of Rupee one per day must be deposited at the time of return of the same.
